Wednesday, January 22 | Event Recap




On Wednesday, January 22, over 60 community members and leaders from diverse backgrounds - including local businesses, nonprofits, government, and philanthropy - gathered at [Blank Space Fort Worth](#) for an evening dedicated to advancing social entrepreneurship in Tarrant County.

The night began with lively networking, fostering connections among attendees from across the community. [Suzanne Smith](#), founder of [Social Impact Architects](#), delivered an engaging presentation, guiding participants through a self-assessment to explore their roles as social entrepreneurs, do-gooders, or changemakers. Her session provided a quick yet impactful crash course on social innovation, social entrepreneurship, and social enterprises, concluding with an introduction to “social alchemy” as a framework for creating transformative social change.
